The Royal Philatelic Society, London, was founded in 1869 and is the most prestigious society devoted to philately. Its headquarters is located in Central London. Patron of the RPSL is Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. The society's journal, *London Philatelist*, is considered a leading publication. There are 1,500 members world-wide, 200 members and fellows reside in the USA. Participation in NAPEX 93 will include social events and a members-only, one-frame-exhibit competition.



The China Stamp Society was established in 1936. The word "China" in the title was adopted because of its broad connotation which, besides China itself, included at the time such areas as Manchuria, Mongolia, Formosa and Hong Kong. By 1949, Korea, Tibet and Macao were added. The People's Republic of China was made a separate area. The journal *China Clipper*, is published bi-monthly. There are over 1,000 members, 300 of whom are from 30 foreign countries.

TODAY'S TREMENDOUS ENTHUSIASM for stamps and coins of Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, Serbia, Yugoslavia and the Central European-Balkan area is due in large measure to the activities of the Croatian Philatelic Society.

The CPS is a non-profit organization, devoted to the study and exchange of information on Croatian and related postal issues, postal history and numismatics. The specialty group was founded in 1972 in Borger, Texas. Its members' interests cover all of the stamps, post cards, coins, currency, maps and military decorations of the entire Central European-Balkan area.

The organization's illustrated quarterly journal, the award winning *Trumpeter*, is edited by Ekrem Spahich of Borger, Texas, founder of the CPS. It carries articles on philately and numismatics as well as news of the CPS and its members located in 27 different countries around the world.

Each year the Croatian Philatelic Society holds meetings and exhibitions, usually in conjunction with a national or regional show. In addition, local chapters and study groups for various Central European-Balkan areas have been established. Services available to members are the expertizing service, library, sales division and translation service.

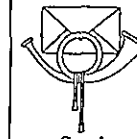

THE POSTAL HISTORY SOCIETY, INC., had its origin in the 1940s when the late Edith Faulstich proposed its formation. The *Postal History Society of the Americas* was founded in 1951; the last three words were later dropped. It is a non-profit organization which provides educational lectures and seminars.

In addition, the *Postal History Journal* contains original postal history studies. The *Journal* was first published as an annual in 1957; it has appeared three times a year since 1968. It is richly illustrated on high quality paper. The *Journal* is a benefit of membership and is widely circulated to libraries and philatelic museums world wide.

The Society takes great pride in its contribution to the recognition of postal history as a class in shows held under FIP patronage.

At our annual convention, held at a major stamp show, an award is presented for the best article appearing in the *Journal* during the previous year. At this time the Postal History Society also presents the Edith Faulstich Memorial Grand Award for the best postal history exhibit in the show.

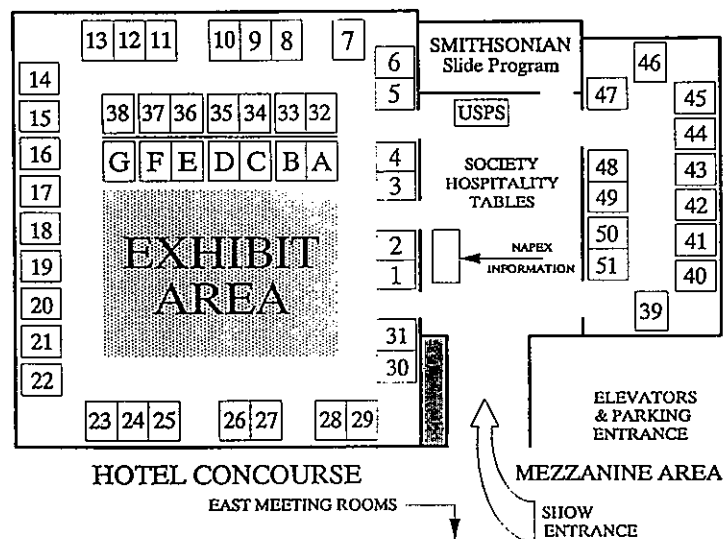

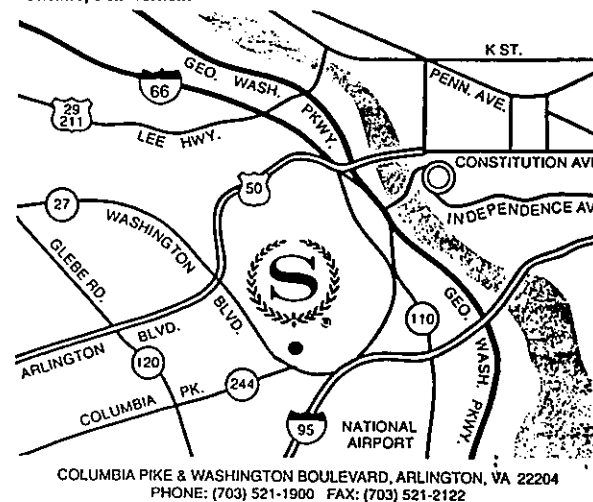
