The National Philatelic Exhibitions of Washington, D.C., Incorporated (NAPEX) welcomes you to our 50th anniversary stamp show. Beyond this year, NAPEX is poised to advance into the new millennium as a non-profit, educational, voluntary organization dedicated to promoting philately in the National Capital Region. This year we are also celebrating the 200th anniversary of the establishment of the Federal Government in the city of Washington, D.C.
